Today, November 3rd Premier Kenney and Health Minister Jason Copping made the following announcement about Booster Shots (Third Doses):

- There has been no evidence of a Thanksgiving spike.
- Drop of 70% in provincial active cases since peak of Fourth Wave in early September.
- We need to continue to be cautious until pressure on ICU units is lessened.
- If you are still on the fence about being vaccinated, seek out qualified sources of information. Thank-you to Albertans who have made the choice to get vaccinated.

Starting Monday, November 8th, booster shots will be available to all those aged 70 and older, and all First Nations, Inuit, and Métis over age 18 (regardless of where they live), who received their second dose at least 6 months prior.

As well, booster shots will be available to direct patient caregivers and received their second shots less than 8 weeks after their first dose. Boosters can be administered 6 months after second dose.

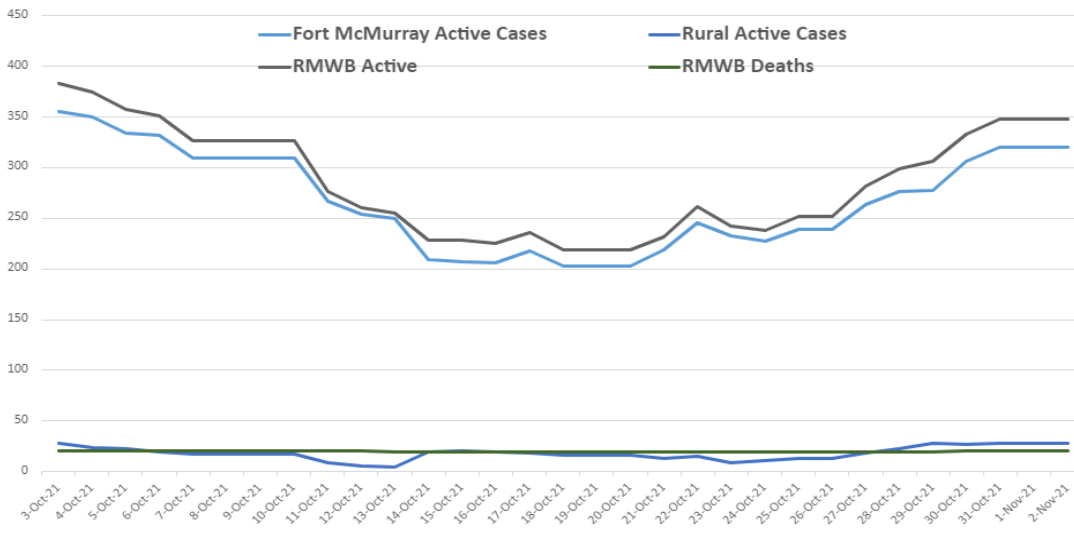
Anyone with only viral vector (AstraZeneca and Janssen) doses is now eligible for a booster dose.



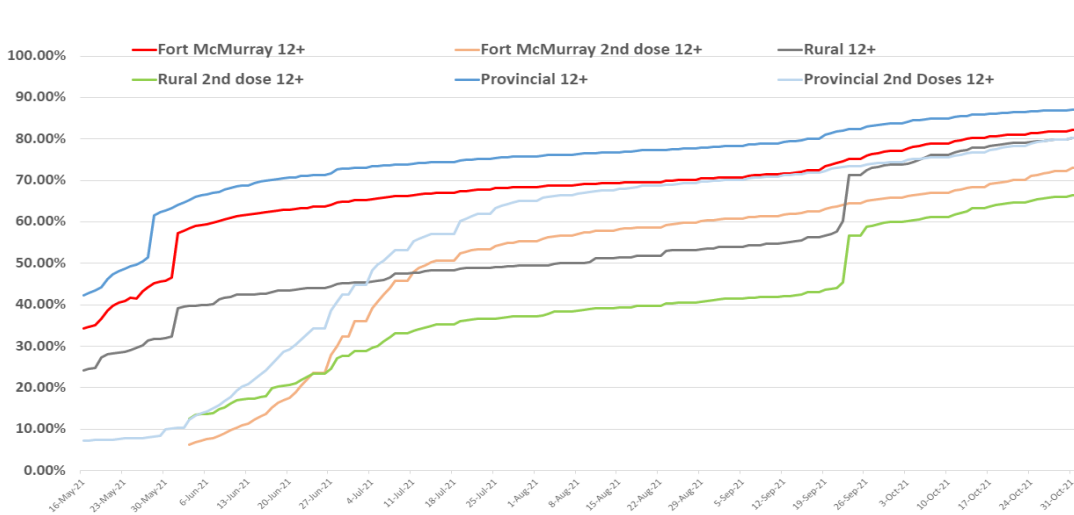
