

- Canada 51,014



Current Measures in Place:

Measures that apply to all of the RMWB (being “Enhanced” status):

Mandatory measures

- Restaurants, bars, lounges, and pubs must stop liquor sales by 10pm and close by 11pm - applies to Class A, B or C licenses (Nov 13-27).
- 15-person limit on social and family gatherings - indoors and outdoors - where people are mixing and mingling.
- 50-person limit on indoor and outdoor wedding ceremonies and funeral services.

Voluntary measures

- No social gatherings inside your home or outside of your community. Instead, socialize outdoors or in structured settings, like restaurants or other business that are subject to legal limits and take steps to prevent transmission.
- Limit of 3 cohorts: your core household, your school, and one other sport or social cohort. Young children who attend childcare can be part of 4 cohorts.
- Wear a mask in all indoor work settings, except when alone in a workspace or an appropriate barrier is in place.
- Employers in office settings should implement measures to reduce the number of employees in the workplace at one time.
- Faith-based gatherings limited to 1/3 capacity at one time.

As well, the following measures apply to Fort McMurray:

Community-specific mandatory measures

- Ban on indoor group fitness classes and team sport activities (Nov 13-27).
- Ban on group performance activities: singing, dancing and theatre (Nov 13-27).

Contact Tracing Notification Process (last updated November 12, 2020)

AHS will directly notify close contacts of cases of COVID-19 confirmed in three priority groups only:

- health care workers
- minors (parents will still be notified by AHS if their child is exposed at school); and,
- individuals who live or work within congregate or communal facilities.

Albertans who are not within the priority groups listed above, who have tested positive for COVID-19, are asked to identify their own close contacts of the exposure.
