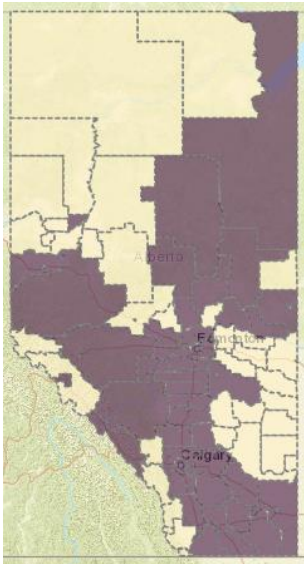


# COVID-19 UPDATE

- Canada 353,097

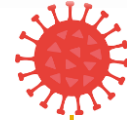

## Demographics (Active)

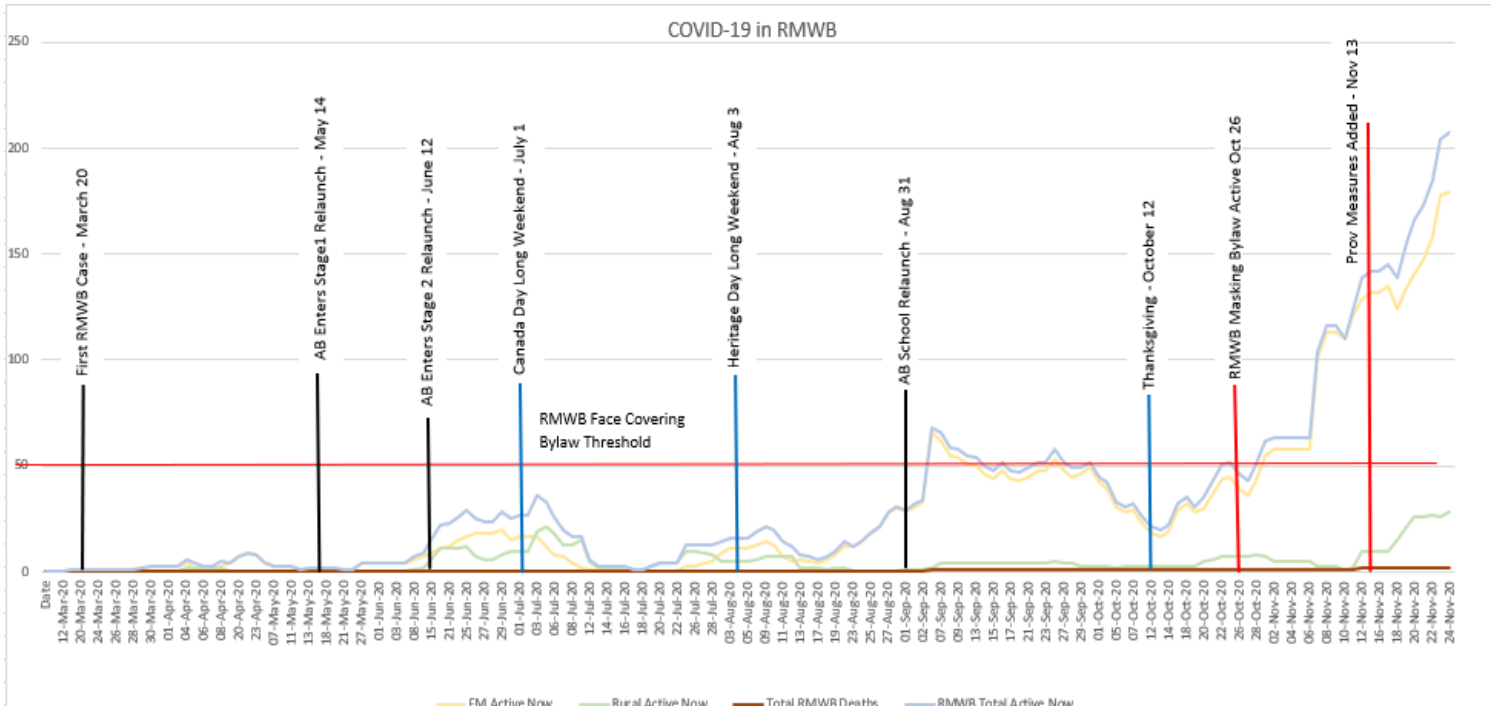
- Fort McMurray 179 (up 1)

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Wednesday Nov. 24th, Premier Kenney, announced the following measures for all of Alberta and communities in the “Enhanced” category, which includes all of the Rural Municipality of Wood Buffalo. Unless otherwise stated, these restrictions will be in place for at least three weeks, Dec. 15.

Businesses Closed for In-Person Service	Open with Restrictions	Open with Restricted Capacity – 25% of Alberta Fire Code
Banquet Halls, Conference Centres, Trade Shows, Auditoria and Concert Venues, non-approved/licensed markets, community centres	Restaurants, Bars, Pubs, and Lounges	Most retail businesses including grocery, pharmacy, clothing, hardware, automotive
Childrens Play Places or indoor playgrounds	Maximum 6 people from same immediate household (people who live alone can have 2 close-contacts)	Some entertainment including movie theatres, museums and galleries, libraries, casinos (slots only) indoor entertainment centres, indoor fitness, recreation, sport (no group fitness)
All levels of sport – exemptions may be considered.	Liquor sales must stop at 10pm and food establishments must close at 11pm.	Appointment only: Personal services, hair salons, esthetics, tattoos, wellness services, lawyers etc.
