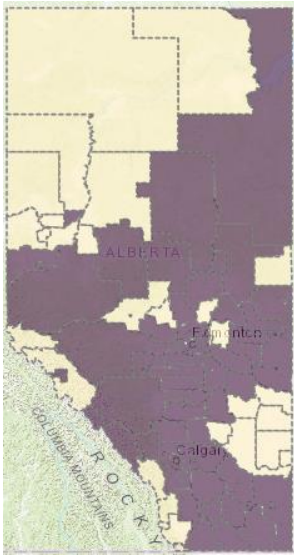


COVID-19 UPDATE

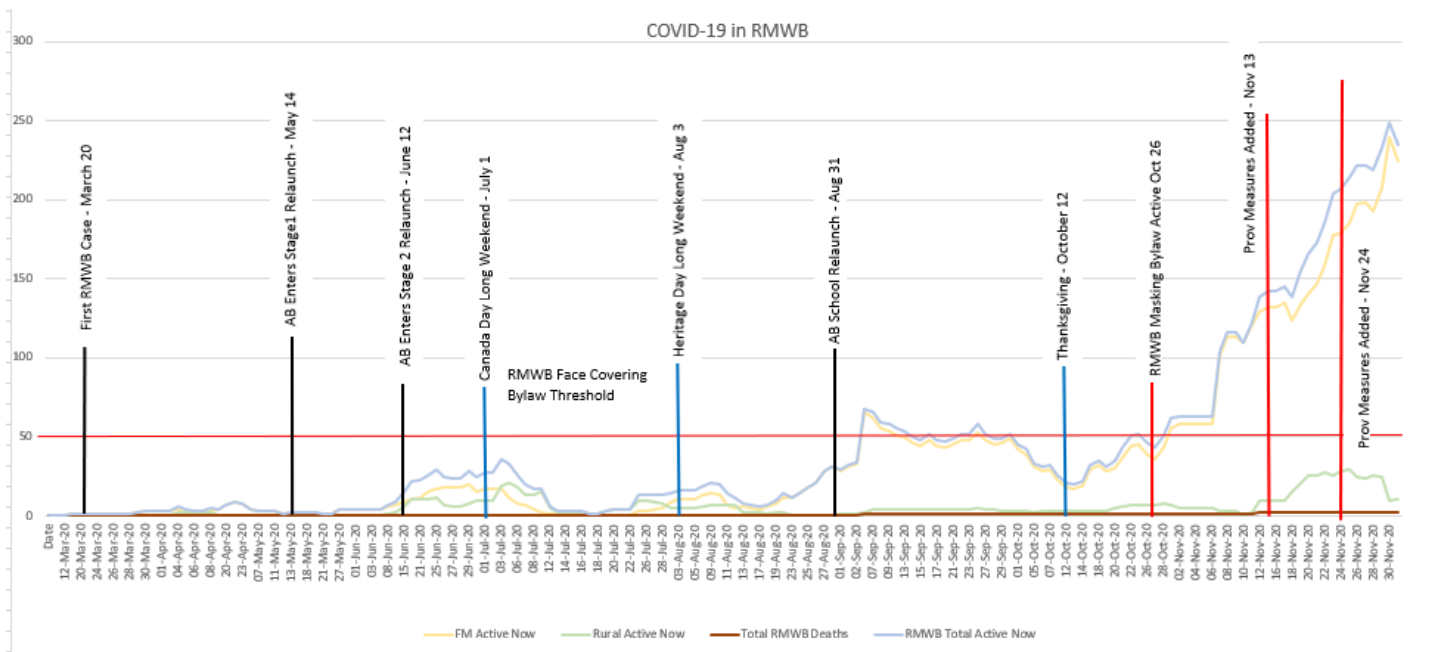

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Vaccination Update

On Wednesday December 2nd, Premier Kenney announced the plans for the [roll-out of vaccines](#) throughout Alberta.

Once COVID-19 vaccines have been approved by Health Canada, Alberta will begin receiving vaccine doses in early 2021.

Vaccines will be distributed through a phased immunization program (exact amounts and timelines are still being finalized):

- **Phase 1** (January to April 2021) – vaccinate about 435,000 people most at risk, including:
 - front-line health care workers
 - residents and staff in long-term care and designated supported living facilities
 - on-reserve First Nations individuals over age 65
 - seniors aged 75 and older
- **Phase 2** (April to September 2021) – continue targeting priority populations
- **Phase 3** (Fall 2021) – anticipated start of roll-out to the general public

All Albertans are encouraged to choose to get inoculated. There will not be mandatory immunization. As the immunization plan is rolled out and more of the population participates, we will see a decline in severe outcomes, however the pandemic will not be over until the majority of people are immunized. Albertans are encouraged to continue to adhere to all public health measures, face masking, physical distancing, hand hygiene, and isolating while ill.

Any Core Symptoms

Albertans are Legally Required to Isolate for 10 days, or quarantine for 14 days if they are close contact of positive Covid-19 case, or if they travelled outside of Canada.

Core Symptoms include:
Cough, Fever, Shortness of Breath, Runny Nose, Sore Throat

Loss of Income

If you experience a loss of income because you are required to isolate or care for someone in isolation, you may be eligible for [financial support through the federal government](#).

When to Isolate

Isolate to avoid spreading illness.

- You tested positive for COVID-19.

- You are sick with fever, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat* or runny nose* and have not been tested.

**Children under 18 are exempt from mandatory isolation for runny nose or sore throat, but should stay home until well.*



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Current Measures in Place

On Wednesday Nov. 24th, Premier Kenney, announced measures for all of Alberta and communities in the “Enhanced” category, which includes all of the Rural Municipality of Wood Buffalo.

Unless otherwise stated, these restrictions will be in place for at least three weeks, until Dec. 15.

All levels of sport – exemptions may be considered.	Liquor sales must stop at 10pm and food establishments must close at 11pm.	Appointment only: Personal services, hair salons, esthetics, tattoos, wellness services, lawyers etc.
