

## *PROCLAMATION*

**WHEREAS** Human Rights Day is observed every year on December 10<sup>th</sup> as a commemoration of the day on which, in 1948, the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights; and

**WHEREAS** in 1950, the Assembly passed resolution 423 (V), inviting all States and interested organizations to observe December 10<sup>th</sup> of each year as Human Rights Day; and

**WHEREAS** the human rights principles protect against discrimination on the grounds of age in relation to accommodation, goods, services and facilities, employment, contracts and membership in trade unions, employer's organizations or occupational associations; and


**WHEREAS** these principles acknowledge that discrimination targets individuals and groups that are vulnerable to attack: the elderly, the disabled, women and girls, the poor, minorities, and all those who are perceived as different. However, these victims of discrimination are not alone; and

**WHEREAS** individuals, institutions and social profits come together to recommit to the principle that, all persons are equal in dignity, rights and responsibilities without regard to age, race, religious beliefs, colour, gender identity, physical ability, ancestry, place of origin, sexual orientation or otherwise.

**THEREFORE NOW**, I, Don Scott, Mayor of the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo, do hereby proclaim December 10, 2018:
