Interim Budget Highlights for Ward 4

At Council's final meeting of 2025 on December 9, Council passed the interim budget for the first quarter of 2026. This ensures that RMWB operations continue without interruption and allows Council the time needed to thoroughly review and debate the full 2026 budget in the new year. Included in the interim capital budget were two important projects for Ward 4: the **Anzac Community School playground replacement** and the **Conklin Multiplex playground repair**. Approval at this stage allows administration to begin moving these projects forward so work can start as early as possible in 2026.

Rural Engagements

Throughout December, IRR had planned to host community engagement sessions in Anzac, Janvier, and Conklin. These gatherings were to include updates from Administration, open discussions on community issues, and of course a game or two of bingo.
