Evacuation

If an emergency impacts your neighbourhood you may be directed to evacuate. If you are being told by local authorities to evacuate, here's what to do:

- Turn off all utilities (water, gas, electricity)
- Close all windows
- Shut off your ventilation system
- Pack up your family, pets and grab your evacuation kit/Go Bag
- Lock your home
- Follow your evacuation route out of the area and register at a designated Registration Centre if directed
- If you do not have a vehicle, go to any bus stop along your evacuation route for pickup
- Stay informed through Municipal updates and local media

Shelter in Place

If an emergency impacts your neighbourhood you may be told to Shelter in Place. If you are being told by local authorities to Shelter in Place, here's what to do:

- Bring your family and pets inside
- Lock all doors
- Close and seal all windows and doors
- Shut off your ventilation system
- Stay informed through Municipal updates and local media
- Stay sheltered in place until authorities say it is safe to leave
