Stat Bank payouts

CUPE Main

Members can carry forward **up to five shifts** in their stat bank. Any shifts exceeding this limit will be paid out on **Dec. 4** (Pay Period 25).

Please ensure that all stat time you intend to use between now and end of day Nov. 27 is entered and approved in SAP by **Nov. 27.**

IAFF

Members can carry forward **48 hours** in their stat bank. Any shifts exceeding this limit will be paid out on **Dec. 4** (Pay Period 25).

Please ensure that all stat time you intend to use between now and end of day Nov. 27 is entered and approved in SAP by **Nov. 27.**

CUPE Transit

Members will have all remaining hours in their stat bank paid out on **Dec. 4** (Pay Period 25).

Please ensure that all stat time you intend to use between now and end of day Nov. 27 is entered and approved in SAP by **Nov. 27.**

Vacation deadlines

CUPE Main

The deadline to enter vacation time for the remainder of the year is **Dec. 11**. All vacation time you intend to use between now and then must be entered and approved in SAP by **Dec. 11**.

Unused vacation, up to your one-year entitlement, will be automatically carried forward into Pay Period 1 of 2026. Any hours remaining that are over your one-year entitlement will be paid out on **Dec. 18** (Pay Period 26).

Time off booked using vacation from **Dec. 12** forward will be taken from your one year carry over or 2026 accrual.

If you would prefer your vacation bank payment be transferred to your RRSP/NRSP, send in your request to pensions@rmwb.ca prior to **Dec. 11**.

CUPE Transit

CUPE Transit employees who have unused vacation will automatically be paid out on **Jan. 15**, **2026** (Pay Period 2 of 2026). The exception will be for employees who have made prior arrangements with, and subject to, their supervisor's approval.

Time off booked using vacation from Jan. 1, 2026, forward will be taken from carry over or 2026 accrual.

If you would prefer your vacation bank payment be transferred to your RRSP/NRSP, send in your request to pensions@rmwb.ca prior to Jan. 8.

Exempt

Exempt employees who have unused vacation will automatically carry over up to five days of vacation into 2026. Anything over five days will automatically be paid out to employees on Jan. 15, 2026 (Pay Period 2, 2026). Time off booked using vacation from Jan. 1, 2026 forward will be taken from your five days of carry over or 2026 accrual. If you would prefer your vacation bank payment be transferred to your RRSP/NRSP, send in your request to pensions@rmwb.ca prior to Jan. 8.

IAFF

IAFF employees who have unused vacation will automatically carry over up to one year's entitlement of vacation into 2026.

Anything over one year's entitlement will automatically be paid out to employees on **Jan. 15**, **2026** (Pay Period 2).

Time off booked using vacation from Jan. 1, 2026, forward will be taken from your one year's entitlement of carry over or 2026 accrual.

If you would prefer your vacation bank payment be transferred to your RRSP/NRSP, send in your request to pensions@rmwb.ca prior to Jan. 8.
