Message from Facilities: Adjustments to Custodial Services

As part of our ongoing efforts to identify potential cost savings while maintaining necessary services across RMWB facilities, we are implementing adjustments to custodial services aimed at better managing expectations and improving overall efficiency.

This will affect all municipal facilities in the urban service area starting in October.

Among several changes, the most noticeable for staff will be the new requirement to place compostable waste (banana peels, apple cores, etc.) in daily-cleared receptacles, such as those located in kitchen areas. This change is intended to support a more sustainable and manageable waste collection process.

Additionally, large-scale semi-annual cleanings may not occur at the same intensity as in the past. Instead, many of the associated tasks will be addressed on an "as required" or "upon request" basis, as well as through regularly scheduled services. This approach allows us to better align services with actual needs throughout the year.

- Private Car Allowance Mileage Expense Claim Form
- Council Travel and Expense Claim and Mileage & Per Diem Form
- Service Entry Sheet Training Manual

Teams, SharePoint & OneDrive: What's the difference!?

Microsoft 365 — including Teams, SharePoint, and OneDrive— is designed to be a universal toolkit to give your team members integrated and flexible ways to work for their projects and tasks.

Feeling confused about these three apps? Read on to find out the difference between them!

Teams

A communication platform that integrates chat, video conferencing and file sharing, enabling real-time collaboration among team members.

Key features:

- Chat-based communication and threaded conversations.
- Video meetings and calls for remote collaboration.
- Integration with SharePoint and OneDrive for file sharing and collaboration in channels. Intended for file sharing, not storage.

Use for: Team collaboration, project discussions, and real-time communication.

SharePoint

A centralized hub for document management and collaboration. It allows teams to create sites for projects, manage documents and share knowledge across the RMWB.

Key features:

- Document libraries for storing and organizing files.
- Customizable site for different teams or projects.
- Integration with other Microsoft 365 tools for seamless collaboration.

Use for: Managing shared content and facilitating organization-wide collaboration.

OneDrive

Designed for personal file storage and management, it allows users to store files in the cloud and access them from any device.

Key features:

- Personal storage space for drafts and files not ready for sharing.
- Automatic syncing with local files on devices.
- Easy sharing options for individual files on devices.

Use for: Individual users to store personal files, drafts and documents that are not ready for collaboration.
