

Hydrant flushing and routine maintenance on water distribution system

The Municipality regularly flushes the Fort Chipewyan water distribution system and does routine maintenance to ensure high-quality, safe drinking water and all regulatory requirements are met.



The water distribution

system is flushed every fall to winterize the system and sanitary flushes are completed a few times a year. During flushing, you will see crews opening the fire hydrants to run water through the distribution system.

There is also a large high-flow pump at the water treatment plant that is tested monthly to ensure it's functioning for the fire department to use in case of emergencies.

The water service at your home or businesses should not be interrupted during routine maintenance but you may notice a fluctuation in water pressure or a slight discolouration. If this is happening, run your cold tap for 15 minutes. If this doesn't resolve the issue, please contact Pulse at 780-743-7000 or 1-800-973-9663 so Municipal staff can look further into this.

The quality of water being produced at the Fort Chipewyan Water Treatment plant is closely monitored and regularly tested to ensure it meets all Canadian Drinking Water Guidelines. Test results are available online at rmwb.ca/waterupdate.



Budget 2025 approved by RMWB Council

The Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo (RMWB) Council approved a \$645.6 million 2025 Municipal budget on December 4, 2024.

The budget outlines a comprehensive plan that balances delivering safe, reliable services with strategic long-term capital investments to support the region's continued growth and sustainability.

The budget is comprised of \$476.2 million for operations and \$169.4 million to be transferred to reserves. The capital budget is \$166.2 million with funding from grants and 2025 revenues.

The overall increase in the budget from last year is due to the increasing costs of material and supplies across Alberta and all of Canada.

Candidate nominations open for 2025 municipal election

Candidate nominations are now open to all eligible residents interested in running for the position of RMWB mayor, councillor or school board trustee.

New rules are in place for 2025 municipal election

Changes to the Local Authorities Elections Act require candidates to submit a notice of intent to appear on the official register of candidates before accepting campaign donations and incurring expenses. In addition, all candidates must complete the nomination process to appear on the ballot.

The general election for the RMWB and all municipalities in Alberta will be held on Oct. 20, 2025.

Nominations are now being accepted from candidates for the upcoming 2025 municipal election. Prospective candidates must file their notice of intent and complete the nomination process by **noon on Monday, Sept. 22, 2025**.

They are not health professionals and cannot provide medical advice.


How Do I Get a Peer Coach?
