Fines and Penalties

There are very serious fines and penalties for not following the Off-Highway Vehicle Pilot Project Bylaw, including impoundment of your OHV and the full repair cost for damaged municipal property.







Starting July 1, 2024, Off-Highway Vehicles (OHV) are allowed on municipal roads in Abasand when travelling to and from the designated staging area. The pilot project encourages safe and responsible OHV use, while providing better ways to stop dangerous riding and damage to municipal parks, urban trails and green spaces.


Always check if an OHV Restriction or Fire Ban is in place before riding. If a Fire Ban is in effect for the Urban Service Area of Fort McMurray, OHV use on municipal roads is prohibited.











Be Mindful of Noise. OHVs need a working muffler and cannot cause unnecessary noise.



Seats For All Passengers. Passengers must be at least six years old and weigh more than 18 kgs. OHV manufacturer specifications must be followed, which may include more restrictive age limits

Be Wildfire Wise. Always bring a shovel, pail or fire extinguisher. Ensure your OHV has a functioning spark arrestor and make frequent stops to remove debris from hot spots.

Keep Roads Clean. Don't track excessive mud and debris onto roads.

Wheels Only. Snowmobiles are not allowed on roads and aren't included in the pilot.

Know the limits

- Stay on the designated Abasand roads and OHV trails in the forested area. OHV use on roads in other neighbourhoods is strictly prohibited.
- Sidewalks, parks, urban trails and greenspaces are off-limits. OHV use is not allowed on the perimeter trail around the Abasand neighbourhood and the greenspace between homes and the trail.
- OHVs must travel the shortest route between your home and the designated staging area or Abasand gas station. You cannot drive your OHV to a neighbour's home, a park, a school or other areas in Abasand.
- Don't park your OHV on the street. OHVs must be parked and stored on your property.
- OHV use on private roads and in parking lots in Abasand is not allowed, unless the owner has directly permitted it.
 Condominiums are located on private roads, with the exception of Abasand Dr.
