Our program offers a unique blend of recreational and educational activities designed for all ages. We aim to create a vibrant community space that fosters creativity, learning, and fun. Participants will engage in a variety of activities that promote physical, mental, and social well-being.

Free Amusement Activities

- Enjoy paddle boating in our spacious 10×10 meters pool, providing a refreshing and enjoyable experience.
- Our inflatables offer thrilling fun for children and families alike.
- A variety of games will be available to encourage friendly competition and teamwork.

Cooking Classes

- Participants will learn essential cooking skills through hands-on classes led by a cookery instructor.
- Classes will cover a range of cuisines, promoting cultural appreciation and culinary diversity.
- Emphasis on healthy cooking practices will empower participants to make nutritious choices.

Crafting Classes

- Our crafting classes will inspire creativity through various mediums such as painting, pottery, etc.
- Participants will have the opportunity to create unique handmade items, fostering a sense of accomplishment.
- Classes will cater to all skill levels, ensuring inclusivity and engagement.

The Amusement Chariot free alternative recreation program, has successfully completed 22 shows. This involved a total of 110 show hours and 252 labour hours, with the help of 40 dedicated volunteers. Approximately 2500 children participated in the program, excluding adult participants. The program was held at 11 different locations in Fort McMurray, providing entertainment and fun for all.

Outcomes: What change do you want to see for the participants by running your program, project, service or event? Organizations are required to identify at least one outcome, that will be measured through the grant period, should the application be approved.

The primary outcome we aim to achieve through the implementation of the Free alternative recreation program is an increase in physical activity levels among participants. By providing access to a variety of recreational activities we hope to encourage individuals to engage regular exercise and adopt a healthier lifestyle. This outcome will be measured through pre and post- program assessments of participants' physical activity levels, as well as through surveys to gather feedback on their overall well-being and satisfaction with the program.

Additionally, we aim to see an improvement in mental health and Social connectedness among participants. Engaging in recreational activities has been shown to reduce stress, anxiety, and depression, as well as foster a sense of community and belonging. We will measure this outcome through self-reported assessments of mental well-being and Social interactions before and after participation in the program.

Overall, our goal is to empower individuals to take control of their health and well-being through regular physical activity and social engagement, leading to improved overall quality of life for participants.

Our program is designed to be inclusive and accessible to all individuals, regardless of their background or affiliation. We have successfully collaborated with a diverse range of groups, including the All Nationals church, Boys and Girls Club, Family Christian Center, Afro-Canadian Festival, Hillcrest Montessori Elementary School, and on occasion, children from the Autism Society have attended our events, in addition to others.

Our commitment to providing alternative mobile recreation options has allowed us to reach a wide audience and engage with various communities. We have also worked closely with organizations such as Tuc's, a cooperative body that has played a crucial role in our success.

By partnering with the people of Wood Buffalo, we aim to further expand our reach and impact, while continuing to provide high-quality amusement equipment and recreational opportunities. We believe that our shared values and commitment to inclusivity make us ideal partners for collaborating on future projects and initiatives.


