FireSmart rebate program helping homeowners pay for upgrades



The **FireSmart Home Rebate Program** is available for all communities in the region.

Residents will be eligible to receive rebates until program funds have been exhausted, limited to one rebate per address and one rebate per homeowner.

Eligible home upgrades:

 Roof replacement - up to \$2,000 (e.g., repairing old/damaged asphalt shingles)



- Roof upgrade up to \$2,000 (e.g., replacing wood shake shingles with asphalt shingles)
- Deck upgrade up to \$1,000 (e.g., replacing wood decking with a fire-resistant material)
- Window upgrade up to \$1,000 (e.g., replacing single-pane windows with multipane windows)
- Fence/gate upgrade up to \$1,000 (e.g., replacing wooden fences or gates that attach to the home with a fire-resistant material)
- Siding upgrade up to \$4,000 (e.g., replacing vinyl siding with stucco)
- New home construction eligible for a siding or decking upgrade rebate

How to receive a rebate:

STEP 1 - Get a free Home Assessment

Ask for a free FireSmart Home Assessment at **rmwb.ca/FireSmart** or by calling Pulse. Details on how to apply for a rebate will be provided during the assessment.





The 2026 Community Investment Program (CIP) is open for applications!

CIP grants help local non-profits, community groups, social profits, athletes and teams bring programs, events, projects and services to life. What impact will you make with CIP funding this upcoming year?

The deadline to apply is **October 14, 2025, at 4:30 p.m.** Applicants are encouraged to review the 2026 CIP Policy, which highlights key changes and this year's funding priorities, before submitting.

Rural Water and Sewer Servicing Connection Updates as of July 2025

Janvier - 27 homes have connected; 35 applications received of 55 eligible properties.



WATER AND SEWER PROGRAM

The 2025 construction season is well underway, and you shouldn't wait any longer to start the process to connect your home to piped water and sewer services.

Why connect your home through the Rural Water and Sewer Servicing program?

- Save a lot of money. The Municipality is offering 0% financing and covering a large portion of your cost. This offer won't be available forever, so don't wait to connect.
- Say goodbye to trucked water deliveries and sewer pickup. Once the connection window closes, the Municipality will no longer be helping arrange these services for homes. It will be your responsibility as a homeowner to coordinate and pay for these services, which can cost hundreds of dollars monthly.
- Increase the value of your home. Adding piped water and sewer services should increase the value of your home by more than the cost to connect through the RWSS program.

How do you connect?

- The first step in applying to connect your home is choosing a certified contractor and asking them to prepare a quote and discussing what this work will entail. A list of certified contractors is available on the municipal website.
- You're in control of the entire application process, but your contractor can take the lead on everything if you prefer.

Connecting your home to piped water and sewer may seem complicated, but we're here to help guide you through the process. 

What projects are eligible?



In order to vote, you must produce for inspection one or more of the acceptable forms of identification required by section 53 of the Local Authorities Election Act. This includes a driver's licence or motor vehicle operator's licence issued by the Government of Alberta, or an identification card issued by the Government of Alberta that contains your photograph, name, and address.

If your government-issued ID only shows a box number, you must also bring a second document that lists your street address or legal land address. If you do not have identification, or cannot confirm your current address, another registered voter in your voting area can vouch for you.

To vote in a Northland School Division trustee election, you must be at least 18 years old, a Canadian citizen, and live in Alberta with your residence in the local jurisdiction on election day. Residents of certain First Nations reserves where agreements with the Division are in place are also eligible to vote.
