Candidate nominations open for 2025 municipal election

New rules in place for campaigning, find more information at rmwb.ca/elections

Candidate nominations are now open to all eligible residents interested in running for the position of RMWB mayor, councillor or school board trustee.

New rules are in place for 2025 municipal election

Changes to the [Local Authorities Elections Act](#) require candidates to submit a notice of intent to appear on the official register of candidates before accepting campaign donations and incurring expenses. In addition, all candidates must complete the nomination process to appear on the ballot.

Call for candidate nominations

Nominations are now being accepted from candidates for the upcoming 2025 municipal election. Prospective candidates must file their notice of intent and complete the nomination process by **noon on Monday, Sept. 22, 2025**.

Find the notice of intent form, nomination forms, required documentation and additional information for interested candidates at rmwb.ca/elections.

The general election for the RMWB and all municipalities in Alberta will be held on Oct. 20, 2025.

The committee will have the authority to:

- Represent public interests and concerns to local RCMP leadership.
- Collaborate with local detachments to plan yearly priorities and strategies.
- Develop community safety plans.
- Ensure service delivery reflects and addresses local needs.

Candidates needed for seven voting positions on the committee:

The committee needs five ward representatives, from communities in each ward in the region. This includes First Nations within the Wood Buffalo or Fort Chipewyan RCMP detachment boundaries.

Voting positions are also available for two public-at-large members from the following groups: Black, Indigenous and persons of colour (BIPOC), immigrants, LGBTQ2S+, persons with disabilities, religious minorities, seniors, women, and youth.

Appointed committee members will need to get the required security clearance.

Is it easy to participate if I live in a rural community?

Many committee meetings can be attended remotely by video call, making it easier for rural residents to participate. Rural committee members will be reimbursed mileage expenses for driving to attend meetings in person.

Board Meeting Highlights March 22, 2025

Northland Online School shares exciting growth and future plans



Principal Mark Burke and Vice-Principal Tessa Dagenais gave an engaging update to the Board about how Northland Online School is growing and evolving. Since opening in 2021, the school has added new grades each year and now serves students from Kindergarten to Grade 12. This spring, they will proudly celebrate their first graduating class.

Northland Online School has become a key part of how students learn across the division. In fact, over 70 percent of Northland's 2023-2024 graduates took at least one course through Northland Online School. Looking ahead, the school plans to launch a summer school in July 2025 and develop an asynchronous adult education program. Students can choose between real-time online classes with a teacher (synchronous learning) or working on their own time with teacher support (asynchronous learning). COMMUNITY CONSULTATION SURVEY



In October 2024, the Anzac Family Community Support Society (AFCSS) started a petition to name a room in the Anzac Recreation Centre after Jane Stroud. But as word spread, many community members felt that naming just one room wasn't enough to properly honour Jane's contributions — they suggested renaming the entire building instead.

With that feedback, the AFCSS submitted a proposal to the Community Identification Committee (CIC) of the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo (RMWB). In February, the committee approved the proposal to rename the Anzac Recreation Centre to the Jane Stroud Recreation Centre.

After that decision, we learned that not everyone in the community agreed with the renaming. To make sure all voices are heard, the motion has been put on hold until a proper community consultation can take place.

This survey is part of that consultation. We want to hear from residents of Anzac, GLE, and FM468FN about whether or not the recreation centre should be renamed the Jane Stroud Recreation Centre.

These items have odours that could attract a bear to your property. Keep your yard clean and store what you can in the house or garage.

- garbage ■ birdseed ■ pet food ■ compost
- fruit-bearing trees and shrubs ■ jerry cans
- motor oil ■ anti-freeze ■ rubber ■ vinyl
- insect repellents ■ air fresheners
- scented candles ■ BBQs ■ cooking oil
- food odours coming from open windows
- food and drinks ■ pop cans and other empties
- rabbits, chickens, other small domestic animals
- grain and livestock feed
