

FORT CHIPEWYAN WATER TREATMENT PLANT UPDATE

Water Conservation Advisory removed for hamlet of Fort Chipewyan

Regular use of tap water may resume. Enhanced monitoring and testing continues

(Fort Chipewyan, AB – November 12, 2025)- The Municipality has removed the Water Conservation Advisory for users of the municipal water treatment plant in Fort Chipewyan. The [Boil Water Advisory was lifted](#) on Nov. 9.

Regular use of tap water may resume

With the advisories no longer in effect, regular use of tap water may resume. The potable water reservoirs have been refilled and the plant is producing more than enough water to meet the demand in the community.

Please **ensure water bleeders are turned on** to prevent pipes from freezing as temperatures drop.

Municipal truck fill is open

The RMWB truck fill station has reopened and is available for water refills. The Municipality would like to thank Mikisew Cree First Nation for making their truck fill available while the advisories were in effect.

Ongoing monitoring and testing

While operators successfully restored regular water service, enhanced monitoring and testing will continue to ensure tap water is safe to drink and Canadian Drinking Water Quality Guidelines are being met. Test results are being shared with the community and are available on the RMWB website.

Boil Water and Water Conservation advisories were issued for the hamlet of Fort Chipewyan on October 30 after low water levels on Lake Athabasca and strong winds stirred up lake sediments and affected the treatment process at the Water Treatment plant. These advisories are no longer in effect.
