WATER AND SEWER PROGRAM

The 2024 construction season is well underway, and you shouldn't wait any longer to start the process to connect your home to piped water and sewer services.

Why connect your home through the Rural Water and Sewer Servicing program?

- Save a lot of money. The Municipality is offering 0% financing and covering a large portion of your cost. This offer won't be available forever, so don't wait to connect.
- Say goodbye to trucked water deliveries and sewer pickup. Once the connection window closes, the Municipality will no longer be helping arrange these services for homes. It will be your responsibility as a homeowner to coordinate and pay for these services, which can cost hundreds of dollars monthly.
- Increase the value of your home. Adding piped water and sewer services should increase the value of your home by more than the cost to connect through the RWSS program.

How do you connect?

- The first step in applying to connect your home is choosing a certified contractor and asking them to prepare a quote and discussing what this work will entail. A list of certified contractors is available on the municipal website.
- You're in control of the entire application process, but your contractor can take the lead on everything if you prefer.



WATER AND SEWER PROGRAM

Below is an example of what your bi-monthly utility bill will look like once your home is connected to piped water and sewer services.



Your bill explained

- Includes curbside collection, waste disposal, recycling fees.
- 2 RWSS Program Bi-Monthly Connection Fee
- 3 \$0.63/m3 variable rate based on the same water consumption, at a reduced rate
- Fixed rate for sewer (\$14.43 per month) x 2 months
- 5 \$1.07 /m3 variable rate based on water consumption on water meter.
- 6 Fixed rate for water (\$28.14 per month) x 2 months

These are 2024 rates from the Council approved Fees, Rates and Charges Bylaw. This Bylaw is updated annually and its customary to see increases to utility rates as part of the updates.




Municipal Development Plan coming to Council

The draft of Municipal Development Plan (MDP) was presented as part of the July 9 council meeting consent agenda and a public hearing is scheduled for September, where we expect Council to approve and adopt the MDP.

The RMWB has prepared a draft MDP document which includes the region's growth concept and a new vision for the future of the region. The MDP is a blueprint for how the region will evolve, thrive, and expand for the next 20 years and outlines a new vision for the community and Municipal Council for our neighborhoods, livelihoods, and future for all in Wood Buffalo.



Emergency Social Services (ESS)

ESS provides individuals or families with supports when they are displaced due to an emergency. Registration centres or other evacuation sites are set up to register evacuees and provide immediate basic needs. This support is available to provide a safe place for evacuees to plan their next steps as they transition to recovery.

Registration centres may provide the following services:

- Food/water
- Shelter
- Clothing
- First Aid/emotional support
- Family reunification
- Animal care and rescue assistance

Applicants are welcome to apply for multiple vacancies. Those not appointed by Council at this time may be added to a pool of applicants for future vacancies.


