SAP updates now live for all staff

Several enhancements have been made to the Employee Self Service (ESS) and Manager Self Service (MSS) systems in SAP. These updates are part of an IT-led initiative to improve functionality and overall user experience, with support from HR and Corporate Services.

Key changes

A new portal in SAP for both employees and managers to use

• You will continue to access it through CORE by selecting "My Self Service" rather than "Employee Self Service" or "Manager Self Service."

Time entry has changed

• While most actions are the same, there is a new process to assign a cost centre, internal order number or position number for acting roles.
