## **Municipal Census 2025, Growth & Outlook**

Exciting news from the 2025 Municipal Census the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo has grown overall for the first time in a decade, with a total population of 107,740, up about 1.6% since 2021. This reflects more people choosing to make our region their permanent home, which strengthens local services, supports the economy, and helps guide future planning. The census also shows growth across both urban and rural areas, highlighting that our smaller communities continue to thrive.
