#### Upcoming changes to utility billing for water and sewer services



As of April 1, 2025, updated flat rates will take effect to align with the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo's Fees, Rates, and Charges Bylaw (Bylaw 24/026).

We have identified that some properties in Fort Chipewyan do not have active utility accounts. The Municipality will work with property owners to ensure proper account setup and billing.

To support residents through this transition, the Municipality will be holding community meetings where you will have the opportunity to ask

questions and receive more information about these changes.

# New Land Use Bylaw being presented to Council March 24

A new Land Use Bylaw (LUB) is being presented to Council for consideration at a Public Hearing on March 24, 2025, at 6 p.m. in Council Chambers at the Jubilee Centre. Community members are encouraged to share their thoughts about the LUB with Council during the Public Hearing.

## What is the Land Use Bylaw (LUB)?

The LUB regulates the use and development of land and buildings within the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo to support safe and sustainable growth. The current LUB has been in place since 1999 and needs to be replaced to respond to the changes over the past 25 years and community needs.



Developed through extensive public engagement, the new Land Use Bylaw is user-friendly with updated regulations that address community needs and will support responsible development and economic growth in the region by providing greater flexibility for new development.


Art paper for Street Banner submissions can be picked up at the Municipal Office or by contacting PULSE at 780-743-7000.

Monthly Pass: Expires on last day of each month. No cash value and are non-refundable or transferable.




