WHAT'S CHANGING?

There are new routes and schedules for all areas of Fort McMurray with more routes and frequent stops at Keyano College. Plan ahead, check the new schedules and route information at **rmwb.ca/transit.**

INTRODUCING NEW SERVICE TYPES

- Core Routes High-frequency routes along major roads with stops at Keyano College campuses!
- Neighbourhood Routes Local service in your neighbourhood and to connect to core routes.
- Transit On Demand Book a ride when you need it.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOU?

Frequent service and fewer transfers

Keyano College is a key destination in Fort McMurray and the new transit system gives you more frequent service and fewer transfers, making it easier to get to class, work or wherever you need to go.

GET THERE FASTER!

Two core routes run frequently and offer direct service to Keyano College main campus.

- Route 1: Thickwood Gregoire.
- Route 2: Timberlea Keyano.

These routes take you directly to the Thickwood and Timberlea Terminals without a transfer, cutting down on travel time and keeping you out of the cold.

STAY CONNECTED LOCALLY

Neighbourhood routes connect you to nearby locations in your community and to core routes. Route 4 Beacon Hill / MacDonald Island provides service to Keyano College and will take you directly to your favourite downtown spots, including MacDonald Island Park and the Wood Buffalo Regional Library.

Note: Route 4 will not run during the week after 6 p.m. or on weekends. But don't worry - we've got you covered with Transit On Demand.

IT'S 2025 - YOU CAN REQUEST A RIDE WITH THE TRANSIT ON DEMAND APP!

FINDING YOUR WAY AND TRACKING YOUR BUS!

Use these apps to plan your trip or track your bus:

- Transit App.
- Google Maps.
- RMWB Transit On Demand App.

Important: The Transit App and Google Maps will not provide RMWB Transit On Demand information. When your neighbourhood route is not available, use the Transit On Demand App to book a ride. RMWB Transit On Demand App does not currently include details for regular routes.

DON'T GET STUCK COUNTING CHANGE - BUY BUS TICKETS OR A STUDENT PASS!

It's cheap and easy to buy bus tickets or student passes for RMWB Transit!
See fare prices and purchase locations below. Remember to bring your student ID when buying passes.

Cash fare (per ride)	\$2.25
18-ride ticket sheet	\$36
Monthly pass (for students)	\$57.75

NEED TO TAKE MORE THAN ONE BUS TO GET TO YOUR DESTINATION?

If you're paying with cash or tickets and need to take another bus to reach your destination, ask your driver for a transfer when you get on.

- Show the transfer to the driver when you board your next bus.
- Transfers are free, and they're valid for 90 minutes.

Note: Transfers are only needed if you're using cash or tickets – not monthly passes.

RIDING THE RIGHT WAY

As a student, you and everyone else have the right to a safe and respectful ride, and everyone plays a role in making this happen. Follow the Transit Code to do your part!



Treat others as you would like to be treated.



Be respectful and courteous.



Be safe.



Speak calmly and kindly.



Respect personal space and privacy.



Do not litter or damage property.



Respect the rights and identities of all.



Be mindful of the mobility needs of others.

NOT ALLOWED ON THE BUS

The following behavior won't be tolerated on any RMWB Transit bus:

- Anything that threatens safety including reckless or dangerous actions.
- Harassment or discrimination of any kind.
- Smoking, vaping, alcohol, or drug use.
- Excessive noise or disorderly conduct.
- Vandalism or graffiti on buses or at bus stops.

Breaking these rules may lead to fines or being suspended from Transit services.

SEE SOMETHING? SAY SOMETHING

- If you see something that doesn't feel right on the bus – like someone acting unsafely, being aggressive, or breaking the rules – say something.
- Let your bus driver know as soon as you can.
- If it's an emergency, call 9-1-1.

CAN'T TALK TO THE DRIVER OR IT'S NOT URGENT?

- Call Pulse at 780-743-7000.
- Share the date, time, bus route, and what happened.

RIDING WITH RESPECT

- RMWB Bylaw and Peace Officers regularly ride school routes to help keep buses safe and respectful for everyone.
- If someone doesn't follow the Transit Code of Conduct, they could face fines or even be suspended from riding the bus.
