Fort McKay Recreation and Cultural Society provides meaningful recreational and cultural programs to the youth, adults and seniors of Fort McKay to cultivate and support the development of healthy lifestyles for all participants.

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### **Brief Summary of the Proposed Program(s) and/or Project(s).**

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Fort McKay Recreation and Cultural Society provides meaningful sports recreation, arts, cultural programs, activities, and experiences which lead to the well-being of the members of the community of Fort McKay. While the emphasis of the programming is on youth, programs and activities for adults seniors is also offered.

Youth: In 2026 FMRCs plans to offer programming that will lead to skill development in volleyball, hockey and football. The youth will also be encouraged to participate and receive instruction in cultural activities such as traditional hand games and Dene games events and to participate in youth conferences and/or workshops that come available. Wellness in sport will be encouraged through workshops and instruction in fitness, nutrition and mental health. The youth will be introduced to positive Indigenous role models and cultural practices such as smudging during these activities. Youth will also be encouraged to assume leadership roles during sports camps and to develop coaching and officiating skills.

Adult/Seniors: FMRCs will continue to support the adults of the community by providing certified officials for coed slo-pitch tournaments, encouraging participation in recreational activities such as volleyball, and hosting special events. FMRCs will encourage and support individuals who are interested in attaining coaching and/or officiating certification.

FMRCs will partner with the Indigenous Sport Council in attaining certification for coaches, officials, trainers, etc, for interested individuals aged 16 and over.

Generous in-kind support is received from community organizations including the Fort McKay First Nation which provides the use of the Fort McKay Arena and outdoor facilities as well as use of a van for local transportation at no cost, the Fort McKay Radio Society which provides free advertising and public service announcements throughout the year, the Elsie Fabian School provides free use of the gymnasium and sports equipment and the Fort McKay Youth Centre which provides a venue for activities at no cost. #### How does your organization plan to address transportation barriers to provide the program, project, service or event? If applicable.

The cost of providing transportation to events and venues outside the community of Fort McKay is a huge barrier to the successful delivery of FMRCs programs. For local use FMRCs has limited access to a passenger van generously supplied by Fort McKay First Nation (in-kind donation). The driver requires compensation which could be provided through an honorarium process. Larger groups must be transported by bus which is an expensive proposition and a barrier for program success. For example a round trip by chartered bus from Fort McKay to Fort McMurray costs \$400.00 while a round trip from Fort McKay to the Edmonton area by chartered coach bus costs \$4000.00.

FMRCs serves the Indigenous community of Fort McKay and partners and collaborates with a number of community organizations. FMRCs programs are inclusive and serve the whole community while concentrating on the wellbeing and the development of healthy lifestyles for the youth of the community. Cultural activities as well as traditional cultural practices are incorporated into the program and the youth interact with positive Indigenous role models. Special events and the adult coed recreational slo-pitch tournaments promote social participation. Sports camps and cultural activities are open to all Aboriginal youth in the Wood Buffalo region.

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FMRCs is always aware of new interests and trends that may develop in the community as professions who interact with community members on a day to day basis are consulted. Youth with special needs are taken into consideration. For example, a young lady with special needs was introduced to the Special Olympics Wood Buffalo program and a young man with special needs volunteers in the community sports program as an equipment manager.

**If applicable, please explain how your program, project, service or event celebrates Indigenous culture, serves Indigenous communities and/or promotes Indigenous healing, language, cultural restoration, or reconciliation.**

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This project serves the Indigenous community of Fort McKay by providing programs, activities, and events for youth, adults, and seniors. The youth are provided access to a variety of programs including sports and cultural activities and they have the opportunity to interact with role models of Indigenous descent who share their life experiences. The Indigenous football program includes cultural teachings by elders and traditional practices such as smudging.

Members of the community of Fort McKay have participated in the Arctic Winter Games, Alberta Indigenous Games and the North American Indigenous games.

In 2025 the Northern Spirits girl's football team hosted its first ever home game in Fort McKay on the Elsie Fabian School football field. The game was attended by approx. 300 fans, and was live streamed. The players were introduced by traditional drumming and players from Northern Spirits and those from the opposing team who chose to do so smudged before the game. Local talent was showcased during the half time show.

**Statement of Need: What social problem or gap do you hope to address by delivering the program, project, service or event? What evidence do you have that this problem or gap exists?**

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Fort McKay is an Indigenous community of approximately 800 residents comprised mainly of Cree, Dene and Metis descent who were impacted by the Residential School system, the 60's scoop and systemic racism, as well as the effect of rapid industrialization (without consultation) on traditional lifestyle, causing intergenerational trauma and other challenges. By providing culturally appropriate programs and activities and interaction with positive role models, FMRCs collaborates with other community organizations to foster positive attitudes and healthy lifestyles amongst the youth, adults, and seniors of Fort McKay.

The evidence is that Indigenous people in Fort McKay and across Canada do not have the same socio-economic status of mainstream or non-Indigenous Canadians.

**Broad Strategy: How will the program, project, service or event address the social problem? (e.g., What approach are you taking that you hope will lead your program, project, service or event to support the social problem?)**

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Fort McKay Recreation and Cultural Society will cultivate participant's interest in healthy activities by providing meaningful and culturally appropriate sports, art, and cultural programming for the youth, adults, and seniors of the community of Fort McKay.

Local individuals who have graduated from the Indigenous football program have returned in supporting roles as coaches, instructors, team managers, trainers, etc.

**Rationale: What evidence or research do we have that this strategy will work? To demonstrate for example, "If [my organization] does 'x' program, project, service or event, then [this] change will happen for the target population."**

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If FMRCs develops and provides meaningful recreation and cultural programs and activities then the youth, adults and seniors of the community of Fort McKay will have increased pride in their community, develop increased self-esteem through positive experiences, and develop a positive attitude toward a healthy lifestyle.

As proof, graduates from the Indigenous football program have had successes in their post secondary education programs and have returned to the community as event organizers and motivational guest speakers in Fort McKay and Wood Buffalo.

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Resources invested include volunteers working along with the dedicated staffs of the Fort McKay Youth Centre, the Fort McKay arena, and the Indigenous Football Development coaches as well as the use of facilities such as the Fort McKay Arena, Fort McKay Youth Centre, Elsie Fabian School, and community playing fields at no cost. The newly opened Fort McKay Community Centre will enhance existing facilities as it will provide a venue to host large gatherings for live music and cultural performances. Meaningful activities and programs will be offered and participants will interact with positive role models many of whom are Indigenous.

Visits to larger neighbouring communities will result in opportunities to use facilities such as swimming pools and field houses that are not available in Fort McKay.

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Youth: Skill development in hockey, volleyball, Indigenous Youth Football development.

Instruction in cultural activities-Dene games, Hand games etc.

This project does not duplicate or overlap with other services or projects in Fort McKay due to continued collaboration with other community groups, and consultation with community members and leaders. This has led to the development of programs that are unique to the needs of Fort McKay. The resources and facilities available in this small rural community are taken into consideration during planning processes. FMRCS is a partner in the Indigenous Youth Football Development program which is unique to the area, provincially, and nationally. This program led to the formation of the Fort McKay Northern Spirits girls football team. Young Indigenous female athletes across Canada now have the opportunity to play on the national Indigenous female football team.

In Oct. 2024 FMRCS partnered with other community organizations to host the Fort McKay Mental Health and Indigenous Symposium. This award winning conference featured a day of educational and healing sessions designed to destigmatize mental health problems and equip participants with tools and resources to manage their own mental health. While the conference featured several keynote speakers it was highlighted by the youth of Fort McKay speaking of their own successful journeys in the fields of arts, sports and culture.


