## Fort McKay Water Treatment Plant update

May 23, 2025

The Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo is aware of a stronger-than-usual chlorine smell in the tap water in Fort McKay. Conditions are improving steadily, and we are working closely with the Province and Indigenous Services Canada to ensure the water being produced at the Fort McKay Water Treatment Plant and in the Municipal distribution system **continues to meet the Canadian Drinking Water Guidelines for chlorine.**

Chlorine is used as part of the regular water treatment process and it's anticipated that the chlorine smell will return to normal by Sunday or earlier. Further updates will be provided if this timeline is not met.

Ongoing monitoring is in place to ensure high-quality drinking water continues to be available to all residents.
