## Fort Chipewyan Water Treatment Plant Update

Water from the Fort Chipewyan Water Treatment plant and in the municipal distribution system continues to meet all Canadian Drinking Water Guidelines. Water quality is closely monitored and tested and the results are shared at <a href="mailto:rmwb.ca">rmwb.ca</a>

#### **Current water levels are not affecting the water treatment plant**

While the water levels on Lake Athabasca are considerably lower than previous years, the water treatment plant has not been affected. Water levels are very closely monitored, with sensors in place on water infrastructure.

### Watch-out for buoys in the channel

The Municipality is taking steps to help ensure the water intake in Lake Athabasca continues to safely draw water if water levels drop further. Crews will be on the lake near the channel working on these proactive measures. Buoys will be installed to clearly mark the water intake to keep boaters safe and prevent damage.

#### Turn off your water bleeder valve

Spring is here and it's time to turn off your home's water bleeder valve. Crews will be going around the community in the coming days to help with turning off valves. If you can lend a helping hand by turning your bleeder off now, it will help crews get this job done faster and avoid unnecessary water use.
