2025 T4s now available

Upcoming CRA deadlines

- April 30, 2026: Deadline to file and pay your taxes (if payment due)
- June 15, 2026: Deadline to file your taxes if you or your spouse or common-law partner were self-employed in 2025

Frequently asked questions

Why do I have two T4s?

If you moved from a temporary to a permanent position or from one group to another, you may have two T4s. You do have to report both to CRA when you file your taxes.

Will my T4 be available on myCRA Account?

Yes, if you have a myCRA account, you should be able to access your T4 through it. However, there may be a delay while CRA transfers the T4s to individual accounts.

Why does Box 14 (taxable income) not match the Year-to-Date Earnings on my pay statement?

If you have an amount in Box 40, taxable benefits, it is included on the T4 in Box 14 as you have to pay taxes on the value of the amount. Add it to your pay statement earnings. If you had non-taxable STD payments, they are not included in Box 14 as you do not pay taxes on them.

For more than 20 years, one of our colleagues has been at the heart of the Pets and Wellness Society (PAWS), a program dedicated to bringing comfort, connection, and companionship to the community.

Koralee Samaroden, program manager, Community Initiatives & Partnerships, began her PAWS journey as a volunteer team member with beloved dogs, Ember and Karma.

By 2010, her commitment to the organization deepened when she took on the role of PAWS Coordinator. At the same time, Koralee's third dog Rizzo entered the program.

Koralee's leadership continued to grow along with the organization, and when PAWS officially became a society in 2019, she became its first president. Today, two more canine companions, Chatter and Deacon, proudly carry on the tradition.

If you're getting too many notifications from **Viva Engage**, here's how you can adjust your settings.

Filter emails automatically

Viva Engage emails are labeled as **[SOCIAL NETWORK]**, so you can easily filter them:

- Right-click on one of these emails.
- Select Rules > Create Rule.
- Redirect them to a separate folder.
