COUNCIL'S EXCELLENCE AWARDS INCLUDE FOUR CATEGORIES:

CITIZEN OF THE YEAR

Honours an individual or group with outstanding contributions and achievements to the community, as a volunteer or professional who has improved the quality of life in the RMWB.

EVERYDAY HERO

Recognizes an individual or group dedicated to improving the lives of those around them, demonstrating selflessness through acts of kindness and making a positive impact in the region. Residents may be nominated for selfless actions related to a single event.

INDIGENOUS ADVOCATE

Honours an individual or group of individuals who has made significant contributions to Indigenous communities in the region.

YOUTH

Why connect?

Say goodbye to water deliveries and septic pick-ups! Once connected, deliveries and pick-ups will no longer be required at your property.

Flexible payment plan: \$105 at 0% interest spread out over 25 years through your bi-monthly utility bill.

Applications can be picked up and submitted at your local municipal office. The cost will significantly increase after the connection window closes (end of construction season).

The Municipality will no longer coordinate or subsidize water delivery and septic pick-ups.

Eligibility

Ownership-You must be registered on Title

Tax-Account-your account must be in good standing

Utility Account- your account must be in good standing.

Historical Indigenous Residential Land Ownership Policy:

Approved by Council on October 8, 2024

May be eligible for the transfer of land from the RMWB to an Indigenous person having historical and continuing connection to a parcel of land If a resident has resided on and used a parcel of land long-term, they may be eligible.

Northland School Division (NSD) is proud to celebrate Anzac School teacher Emily Griffin and Lakeside Leader newspaper editor Pearl Lorentzen, who were recognized at the Alberta School Boards Association (ASBA) Zone 1 Fall Awards Ceremony.

NSD nominated Emily for the Edwin Parr Teacher Award, which honours first-year teachers who show exceptional dedication and commitment to education. At Anzac School, she creates a welcoming classroom where students feel safe, respected and ready to learn. Emily uses tools like the ViewSonic board, videos and visuals to keep students engaged and to support their understanding.
