WATER AND SEWER PROGRAM

The 2024 construction season is well underway, and you shouldn't wait any longer to start the process to connect your home to piped water and sewer services.

Why connect your home through the Rural Water and Sewer Servicing program?

- Save a lot of money. The Municipality is offering 0% financing and covering a large portion
 of your cost. This offer won't be available forever, so don't wait to connect.
- Say goodbye to trucked water deliveries and sewer pickup. Once the connection window closes, the Municipality will no longer be helping arrange these services for homes. It will be your responsibility as a homeowner to coordinate and pay for these services, which can cost hundreds of dollars monthly.
- Increase the value of your home. Adding piped water and sewer services should increase the value of your home by more than the cost to connect through the RWSS program.

How do you connect?

- The first step in applying to connect your home is choosing a certified contractor and asking them to prepare a quote and discussing what this work will entail. A list of certified contractors is available on the municipal website.
- You're in control of the entire application process, but your contractor can take the lead on everything if you prefer.



Council's Excellence Awards call for nominations opens Aug. 15

Help recognize outstanding people in your community by nominating them for Council's Excellence Awards!

These citizen recognition awards acknowledge community members or groups in the region for their contributions and positive impact. Wood Buffalo residents may be nominated for one of the four award categories:

Citizen of the Year

The Citizen of the Year award honours an individual or group of individuals with outstanding contributions and achievements to the community, as a volunteer or professional that has improved the quality of life in the RMWB.

Everyday Hero

The Everyday Hero is dedicated to improving the lives of those around them, demonstrating selflessness through acts of kindness and making a positive impact in the region.

Indigenous Advocate

The Indigenous Advocate award recognizes an individual or group of individuals who has made significant contributions to Indigenous communities in the region.

Youth

The Youth award recognizes a youth or group of youths whose exceptional achievements have improved quality of life in the region or brought positive recognition to the region. Candidates must be between 15 - 34 years as of December 31, 2023.

Aside from the Youth Award, the other three categories are open to nominees of all ages. Any nominee must have lived in Wood Buffalo for a minimum of 12 consecutive months.

Protect yourself from extreme heat

Summer is fully here.

While we enjoy the warmth, there may be days when we will face some extremely high temperatures.

This presents the greatest risk for:

- people over the age of 65
- infants and young children
- people with chronic illness such as breathing or heart problems
- people who work or exercise in the heat
- people who are overweight



Stay cool so you and your loved ones can beat the heat.

- Drink fluids, especially water, before feeling thirsty.
- Slow down! Your body can't function as well in high temperatures.
- Cool down in cool store, public library, or community pool.
- Shade heads and faces with a loose-fitting ventilated hat or umbrella when outdoors.
- Dress appropriately in lightweight, light-coloured, and loose-fitting clothing.
- Avoid getting sunburned. It decreases the body's ability to cool.
- Never leave infants, children, or pets inside a parked vehicle.
- Remember to check on elderly family members, neighbours, and friends to make sure they are comfortable and safe.





Emergency Social Services (ESS)

ESS provides individuals or families with supports when they are displaced due to an emergency. Registration centres or other evacuation sites are set up to register evacuees and provide immediate basic needs. This support is available to provide a safe place for evacuees to plan their next steps as they transition to recovery.

Registration centres may provide the following services:

- Food/water
- Shelter
- Clothing
- First Aid/emotional support
- Family reunification
- Animal care and rescue assistance





VPR

Emergencies happen. If you are a vulnerable person living in the region, you may be at greater risk during an emergency.



The Vulnerable Persons Registry (VPR) is a service that improves the safety of vulnerable residents living at home.

This is done by communicating directly with registrants during emergencies and by sharing key information to first responders about individuals on the VPR.

MAERS

The MyAlberta Emergency Registration System is available to all residents of Alberta as a tool to assist during an evacuation or emergency. Albertans can register themselves and their family members in advance of an emergency using their MyAlberta Digital ID. Scan below to pre-register today.





Rebate program launched for FireSmart home renovations

The Municipality is launching a rebate program to help homeowners in the region use fire-resistant materials in home renovations.



The **FireSmart Home Rebate Program** may provide a grant to eligible homeowners who get a FireSmart home assessment and complete the recommended work.

Eligible home upgrades:

- Roof replacement up to \$2,000 (e.g., repairing old/damaged asphalt shingles)
- Roof upgrade up to \$2,000 (e.g., replacing wood shake shingles with asphalt shingles)
- Deck upgrade up to \$1,000 (e.g., replacing wood decking with a fire-resistant material)
- Window upgrade up to \$1,000 (e.g., replacing single-pane windows with multi-pane windows)
- Fence/gate upgrade up to \$1,000 (e.g., replacing wooden fences or gates that attach to the home with a fire-resistant material)
- Siding upgrade up to \$4,000 (e.g., replacing vinyl siding with stucco)
- New home construction eligible for a siding or decking upgrade rebate

To receive a rebate, residents must first book a free <u>FireSmart Home Assessment</u> online at **rmwb.ca/FireSmart** or by calling Pulse at 780-743-7000.

Rebates will be provided on a first come, first serve basis after confirmation of the completed work by FireSmart team members.

The rebate program is being funded to a total of \$100,000 for this year. Residents will be eligible to receive rebates until program funds have been exhausted, limited to one rebate per address and one rebate per homeowner.

The program is available in all communities in the region, with some funds being specifically reserved for rural areas.



BE BEAR AWARE

It's springtime, which means bears are now crawling out of hibernation dens in search of food. Many areas within the RMWB are in bear territory, so we need to be aware. Below are a few key safety points to keep in mind:

- · Never feed wildlife.
- Dispose of waste in proper waste receptacles.
- Make noise so bears can hear you coming talk, sing or give a shout out when approaching a blind corner.
- Don't wear headphones or anything that will interfere with your ability to detect nearby wildlife.
- Be aware of your surroundings (situational awareness).
- Watch for signs of bear activity such as tracks or scat.
- Consider carrying air horn or bear bells.
- Do not take pictures.
- Refrain from picking garbage in areas that have had recent bear sightings.
- Be extra aware during early morning and evening hours.
- Leash your dogs.

If you encounter a bear,

- Back away slowly and cautiously, but do not turn your back
- Stay calm
- Do not run
- Give the bear space
- Use an air horn, whistle or other bear deterrents
- Stay close to those you are with
- Talk calmly
- Wave arms slowly
- Avoid eye contact
- · Leave the area

Situational awareness is not a skill; it's a mindset of being aware of your surroundings.






